271 King St., Philip Schuchmann worsted-goods business (1872)

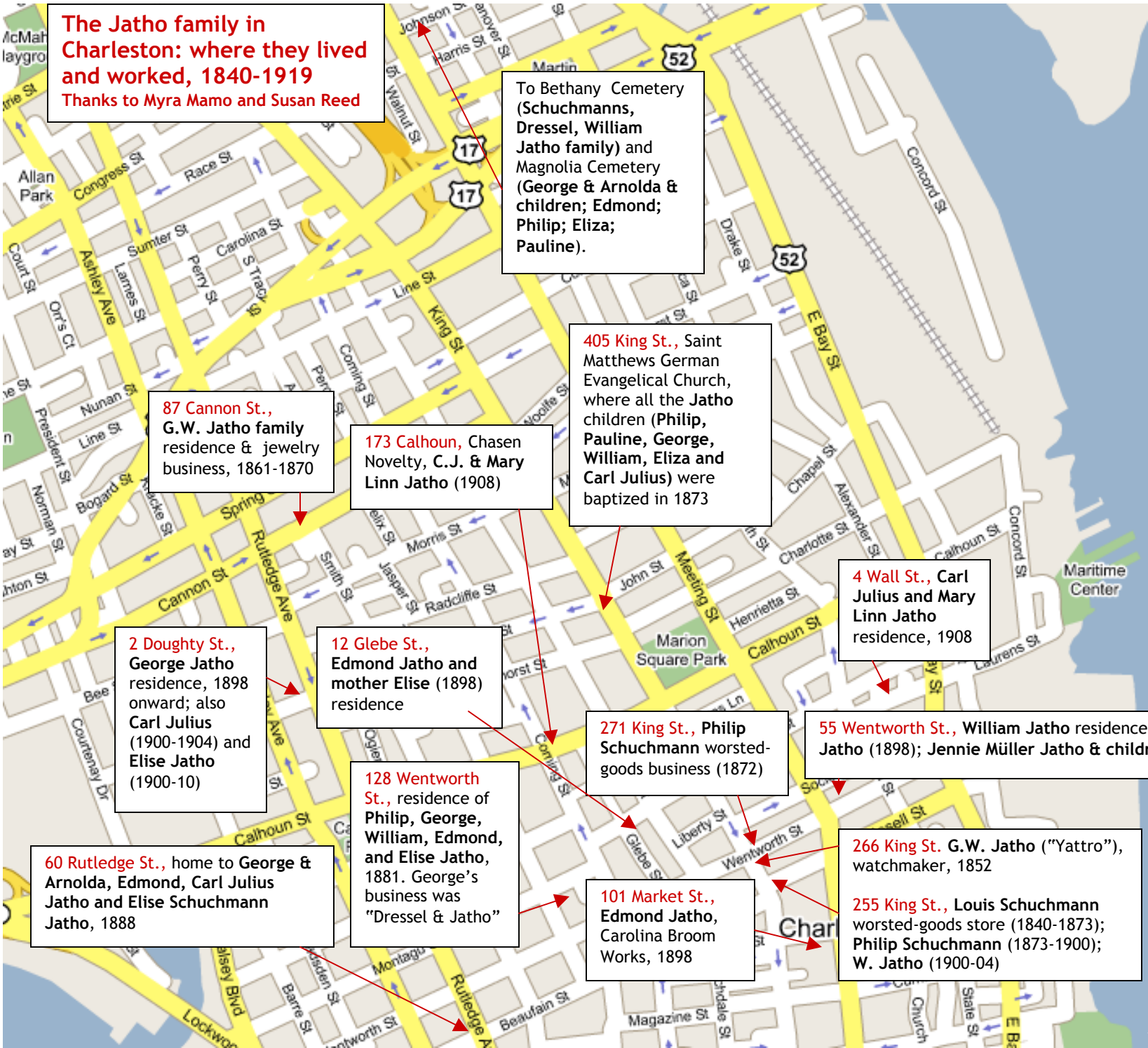
55 Wentworth St., William Jatho residence; also Edmond Jatho (1898); Jennie Müller Jatho & children (1904-10)

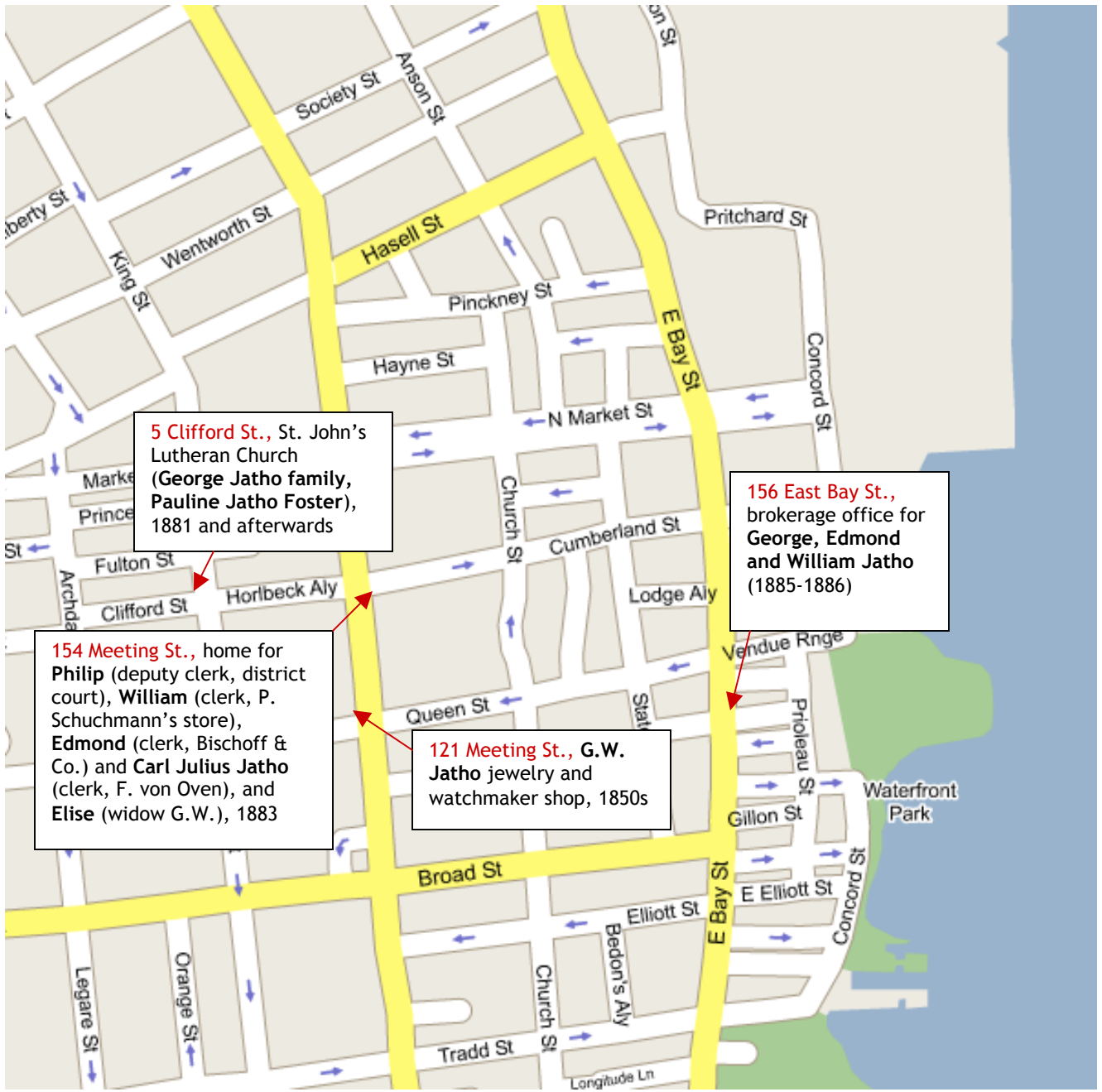
60 Rutledge St., home to George & Arnolda, Edmond, Carl Julius Jatho and Elise Schuchmann Jatho, 1888
